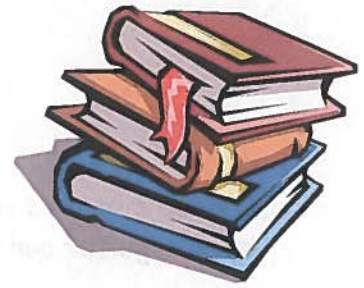




EAGLE College Prep Summer Reading 2018

The Giver, by Lois Lowry




SEVENTH AND EIGHTH GRADES

Choose one Biography and one AR book of your choice to read over the summer. Scholars will need to complete the book report forms for both books by the second week of school.

7th and 8th grade scholars also need to memorize squares and square roots, cubes and cube roots.

ALL GRADES

Practice addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts 0-12 (whatever is appropriate for each grade level) over the summer. The goal will be to complete 100 problems in under 5 minutes when school begins in August.
