



Extracurricular Participation Policy

Academic and Character Eligibility Requirements

1. Introduction

1.1. Purpose: This policy was created to insure that EAGLE scholars, families, staff, club sponsors and coaches maintain an “academics-first” philosophy. Academic greatness is incentivized and rewarded with participation in EAGLE sports, clubs and activities.

1.2. Scholars who wish to participate in an extracurricular activity must adhere to:

- EAGLE College Prep Family Handbook
- this policy including codes of conduct
- any sport, club or activity specific requirements or expectations

2. Definitions

2.1. Extracurricular Activity – Any activity that’s sole purpose is anything other than academic support that is provided, sponsored, coached or overseen by any EAGLE staff member or their designee.

2.1.1. Examples – sports (clubs or competitive), student council, honors societies, music/choir clubs

2.1.2. Does not include – tutoring, field or class trips, independent vendor services

2.2. Meetings – Any activity gathering that typically occurs three (3) times per week or more.

2.2.1. Examples - sports practices (considering frequency as if there were no matches), M/W/F music practice

2.3. Game/Events – Any meeting or activity typically occurring less than three (3) times per week.

2.3.1. Examples – league games, bi-weekly club meetings, weekly music practices, weekend events

2.4. Passing – Letter grades of A, B, or C as determined by the teacher. A grade can only be appealed to the teacher who assigned it.

3. Academic Eligibility

3.1. Expectation: Maintain a passing grade in all classes

3.1.1. Measure: All passing grades achieved on the grade check.

3.1.1.1. Grades will be reviewed prior to the first game/event and at minimum of every three (3) weeks thereafter. Progress reports and report cards will serve as a grade check.

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3.1.1.2. This process is prescribed and completed by the administrator responsible for oversight of the activity. They may delegate completion to another certified staff member.

3.2. Ineligibility: All meetings and games/events require passing grades in all classes.

3.3. Restoration: Eligibility can be restored at the next regular grade check or after a complete supplemental grade check submitted to the overseeing administrator or their designee showing passing grades in all classes.

3.3.1. This supplemental grade check privilege is at the convenience of the teacher(s) and not on demand by the scholar, parent or coach.

4. Character Eligibility

4.1. Expectation: Demonstrate positive character and behavior choices

4.1.1. Measure: Absence of current or pending detentions or suspension

4.2. Ineligibility: All meetings and games/events require scholars to be free of current or unserved detentions or suspensions.

4.3. Restoration:

4.3.1. Detention – A scholar must satisfy any detention that can be served at the time of the activity before participating.

4.3.2. Suspensions, On and Off Campus – Unless otherwise cited as a condition of the suspension:

4.3.2.1. Meetings - a scholar will be allowed to return to activity meetings the day after completion of the suspension.

4.3.2.2. Games/Events – The scholar will be eligible to return to games/events only after he/she has been ineligible through as many games/events as days (any portion) s/he was suspended.

5. Transportation

5.1. Transportation is a necessary element of some extracurricular activities, and must be provided in a timely manner by the parent or guardian.

5.2. Scholars will arrive and be picked-up on time or arrangements made to transfer to alternative care.

5.2.1. Scholars should arrive and be picked-up according to the prescribed activity times.



5.2.2. If a meeting or game/event does not commence at dismissal, scholars must be picked-up at dismissal and dropped-off at the scheduled start time.

5.2.3. Activities that require early dismissal will follow the procedures cited in the Family Handbook.

6. Appeals

6.1. Academic and Character Eligibility

6.1.1. Circumstantial appeals to this eligibility policy are the responsibility of the administrator responsible for overseeing the activity. No exception rights lay with the sponsor, teacher or coach.

6.1.2. Grade questions should be addressed to the teacher that assigned. No additional appeal is available.

6.2. Sponsor, Staff & Coach Decisions - EALGE trusts and stands behind each sponsors, staff and coach. A scholar's selection, inclusion, ability level, playing time, roles and any other activity specific decisions rest with the sponsor, staff or coach and are 100% final. Participation is strictly by choice of the scholar and their family. Consistent with the mission and acronym of EAGLE, extracurricular sponsors, staff and coaches will be open to discuss how to help each scholar progress, but there is no process of appeal.

6.3. No portion of activity or registration fees will be refunded for any policy cited in this or other handbook policies.

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We (parents and players) have read and hereby agree to abide by the EAGLE athletics/clubs code of conduct. We also understand that failure to do so is subject to disciplinary action, including but not limited to the following in any order or combination, at the discretion of EAGLE administration:

- Oral and written warning
- Suspension or immediate ejection from any EAGLE athletic/club event
- Suspension from multiple EAGLE athletic/club events
- Season Suspension
- Permanent termination from some or all EAGLE athletic/club events
- Notification of and request for support by local law enforcement

Note: No reimbursement of fees will be made due to the dismissal of a scholar from a game or the program for not adhering to this contract or academic ineligibility as outlined.
